Back to School: What Every Parent Needs to Know About Fentanyl Poisoning September 19 Panel Discussion & Simulated Teen Bedroom One Pill Can Kill: The Fentanyl Poisoning Crisis

(HASTINGS, MN) United Way of Hastings (UWH) continues to offer public awareness events to build awareness of fentanyl poisoning, reduce the stigma of overdoses, and provide resources. The next event is on Tuesday, September 19 from 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm and is titled, *Back to School: What Every Parent Needs to Know About Fentanyl Poisoning.* The event is being held at the Hastings High School Auditorium. Doors open at 6:00 pm and several organizations will be available with information and resources in the auditorium foyer. The panel discussion and audience Q&A is from 6:30 pm – 7:30 pm. Then from 7:30 pm – 8:30 pm, there will be a brief presentation regarding signs of drug usage with a simulated teen bedroom that attendees can walk through. The free offering is a parent and adult only event and is being sponsored by Allina Health.

"UWH continues to work with many community partners to build awareness on fentanyl poisoning, the ease of obtaining illicit fentanyl, and it's deadly outcomes," said UWH Executive Director, Mari Mellick, CAE. "We continue to alert the community that this is a crisis and hope to capture parents and other adults as kids head back to school. The illicit fentanyl keeps coming in alarming quantities."

The latest updates on the local fentanyl poisoning crisis and overdoses in the community will be provided by law enforcement, the education community, healthcare community, & others with a good portion of time set aside for Q&A from attendees.

After the first hour of the program, there will be a brief presentation on the signs of drug use and ways teens may disguise drug usage. Tips for talking with children will be covered. The speakers will also cover the signs of overdose, the Good Samaritan Law, and webs of support. Event attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions and walk through a simulated teen bedroom.
